

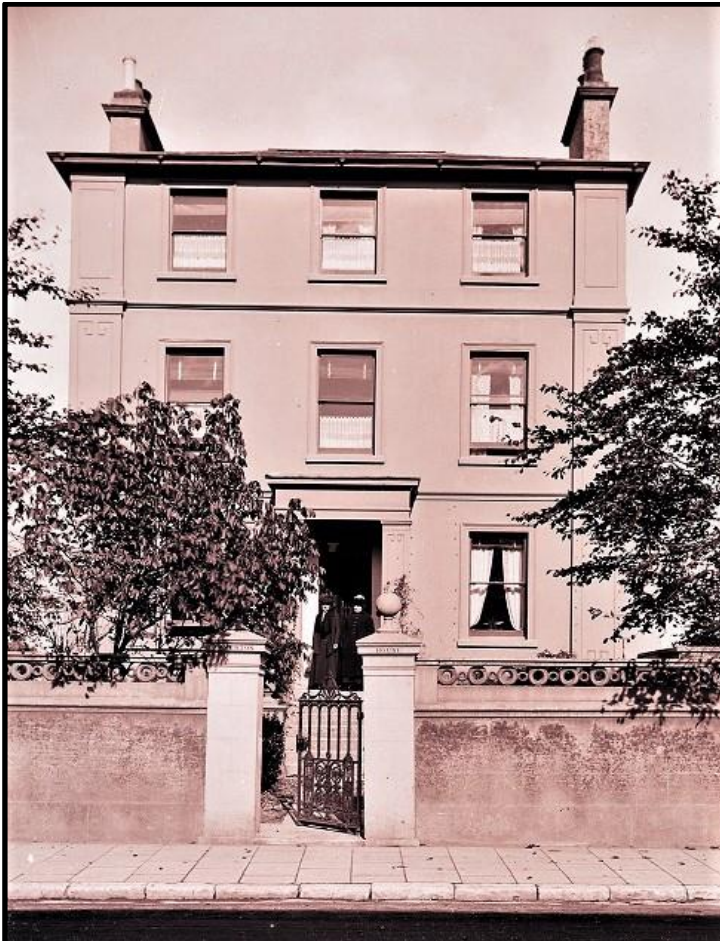

3 Marine Terrace is situated on Castle Street, Ryde.

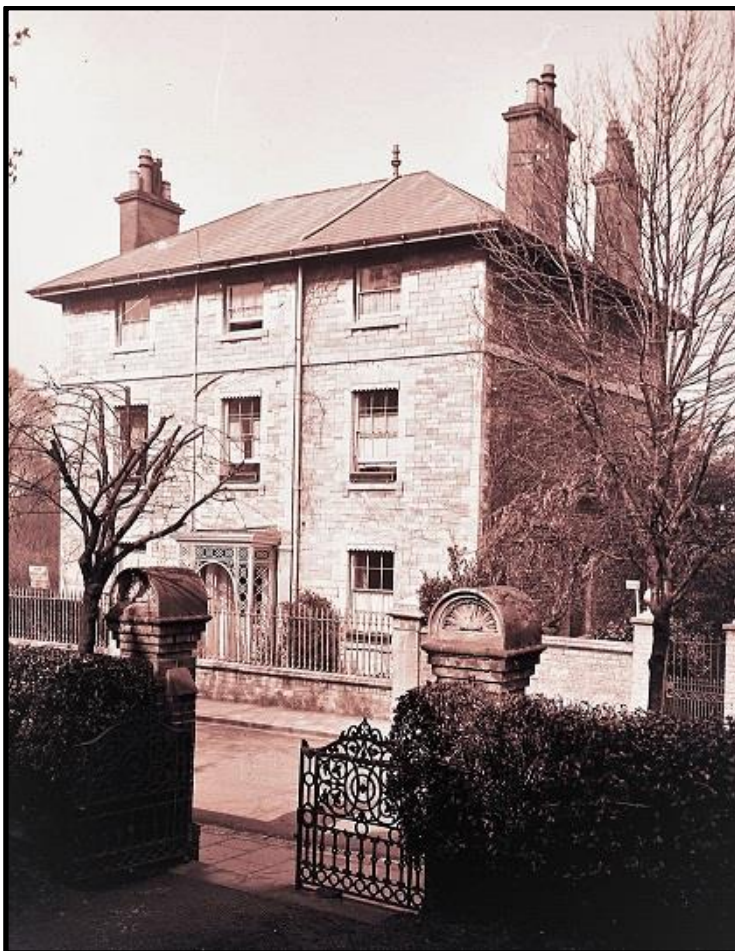

Althorp House

Althorp house in Spencer Road is a three storey building. The facade is faced with stone cut to imitate brickwork.

Spencer Road was named after the *2nd Earl Spencer* (1758 - 1834). He built the first house in the area in 1811.
