Proposed changes to Policy EV5

- The Planning Inspectors requested that the proposed buffer to ancient woodland should be the same size buffer that is set out in <u>national standing advice</u> published by Natural England and Forestry Commission;
- Therefore the council are proposing to change the wording in policy EV5;
- The proposed wording changes to policy EV5 are set out below <u>new text</u> or <u>removed</u>

EV5: Trees, woodland and hedgerows

The council recognises the wider benefits of trees, woodlands and hedgerows and therefore development proposals will be supported where they:

a propose on or off-site tree planting, using the council's Tree Planting and Management Strategy as a guide to planting the right type of tree in the right place;

b retain trees, woodlands and hedges on site wherever possible, especially where they are of high amenity;

c avoid direct and indirect harmful impacts on trees, woodlands and hedges, and where this is not possible adequate mitigation must be provided;

d provide at least a 50 metre 15 metre buffer between new development and ancient woodland. Where assessment shows impacts will extend beyond 50 metres 15 metres, larger buffers will be required, and any buffer should contribute to wider ecological networks and become part of the green infrastructure for the area.
